ROOM PARTIES: If you are having a room party, remember, this is the South. We are friendly and inclusive. Whether your party is in the Consuite or in a hotel room with the door open, the expectation is that it is open to all LibertyCon attendees. If your party is intended to be private, it should not be in the Consuite, and if your party is in your room, please keep your door shut so that misunderstandings and hurt feelings don't occur. Also, Tennessee State Law does not allow the consumption of alcohol for anyone under 21 years of age. If you are serving alcohol, please check everyone's ID. YOU are responsible for this no matter where your party is. LibertyCon will not assume any responsibility to check badges for any type of party. Don't assume if someone has a drinking badge that they are 21 or over.... badges can be swapped.

**GRILLS & OUTDOOR COOKING:** No grills are allowed on the hotel premises. The hotel has informed us that this violates their insurance policy. We have a wonderful hotel and would like to keep our great relationship with them.

**EJECTION FROM THE CONVENTION:** If you are ejected from LibertyCon because of violation of the convention rules or Tennessee State Law, your attendance fees will not be refunded.

**LOST BADGE POLICY:** If you lose your badge at the convention, you will have to purchase another one at the full admission price of \$50. We are sorry to take this rough stance, but incidents with people (Not Fans) purchasing a replacement badge to give/sell to a friend at a reduced price only increases the cost of the convention for real fans and this is the only way we can curb it.





# DAVID M. WEBER [ITERARY GUEST OF HONOR



David Weber is one of those larger than life personalities you only get to meet so many of in a lifetime, well, unless are lucky enough to be in the con scene that is. Combine him with his wife Sharon and you have a pair that just seems to attract incredible people all around them like moths to a flame.

I first found David by picking up a book with a cool cover (of course it was a Baen book, it HAD to have a cool cover) called "Ashes of Victory," which happened to be in the middle of the Honor Harrington series at the time. To David's credit I was able to pick the series up there having never read the earlier books. From there I branched out into his myriad other series, of which there are ten, which he has either written on his own or

co-written with such authors as Steve White, Eric Flint, John Ringo, and more. That does not even count the stand-alone books he has written or the many anthologies he is a part of. Being a published writer for both Baen and Tor since 1990 does tend to help one have a lot to choose from to read, especially given David's output of several projects a year.

Books are not the only thing that David has among his accomplishments. Several of his works have been turned into tabletop strategy games in the form of "Starfire" and the "Saganami Island Tactical Simulator." His "Honor Harrington" series is currently in the early process of being turned into a movie and recently had its own comic books and graphic novel as well as a young adult prequel series. "Honor Harrington" even has an official fan club called "The Royal Manticoran Navy" with members worldwide!

I first got to actually meet David and Sharon in March of 2014 at the comic book signing he held at Richard's Comics and Collectables in Greenville, SC. I had been chatting with Sharon online and found out that the signing was only 5 hours from my house, almost a straight shot down the highway. Needless to say I and a very good friend went on a road trip that weekend. Not sure what to expect, we entered the store and upon introducing ourselves were immediately pulled into a hug by Sharon who was still recovering from some surgery at the time. Nervous to meet someone whom I admired, I admitted that to Sharon and, in what I learned to be her usual inimitable fashion, she pulled me and my friend up to where David was sitting and proceeded to make introductions as if we had known each other for years. Thus began a wonderful friendship!

As for a story...well I was given the opportunity to interview David last year for another convention's YouTube channel. This was the first time I had been down to his and Sharon's house and the first time in many years I had interviewed an author, especially one as famous as David is! To say I was nervous was an understatement but David and Sharon quickly made me feel at home. Interviewing David was a treat as he answered all of the questions I could come up with both before and spur of the moment. What was funny about the interview is that on the video there is about a half hour gap of nothing but audio. I had two cameras and an audio recorder set up for recording but the cameras each had a two hour limit on them due to their memory. David out interviewed them and only my audio recorder was able to capture the entire interview!

I don't know how he did it. In addition to completing his art and regular school assignments, Sam was involved in several gaming groups: Dungeons & Dragons, Warhammer Fantasy, Warhammer 40k, HeroClix, Vampire: The Masquerade, Lord of the Rings, Star Wars, and countless others. Sam even dipped his toe in a little boffer LARP action for a few months.

While he was officially in school for art, Sam was also inadvertently getting an education in the gaming industry. Little did we know this "education" would come in handy in the future! There were several moments at conventions where Sam would geek out over game products with art directors, and BAM! He'd get hired because he knew the ins and outs of their intellectual property. Never underestimate your love for games!

Fast forward 10 or so years: Sam is definitely NOT a graphic designer anymore (though I still am!) but instead illustrates for various game companies; he is pursuing his love of Norse mythology through his paintings; and he is helping other fantasy artists connect through One Fantastic Week, a weekly web show he cohosts. The only downside to his busy schedule is that he rarely plays games anymore. Well, maybe every now and then, when he's teaching our 5-year-old daughter how to play HeroClix. She's inherited her father's love of games, thank goodness. And she sometimes beats him, too!

# DR ROBERT HAMPSON

# SCIENCE GUEST OF HONOR



This year's Science Guest of Honor is known to many by his various personalities such as, Speaker to Lab Animals, Tedd Roberts or Dr. Robert Hampson. Dr. Hampson claims he was born to wonderful parents, grew up in Texas, attended university then went on to grad school. He is a Professor at the Wake Forest School of Medicine where his research focuses on the hippocampus and cannabinoids. While his history since he entered university was confirmed, there have been some suspicions about his origins before that. It has been suspected that Speaker was genetically created in a growth vat and raised by hyper-intelligent rats to study and understand the human brain with an eye towards world domination.

Speaker, Tedd, and Dr. Hampson are all authors. Dr. Hampson has authored over 100 peer reviewed articles, has reviewed for 30 journals, two foundations, and four federal agencies and has been the editor of a prominent neuroscience journal. 





# STEVE JACKSON

## SPECIAL GUEST OF HONOR

I blame the Illuminati. But then, doesn't everyone?

I first "met" Steve Jackson about twenty years ago, during the **Illuminati: New World Order** craze. I'd created a fan page for the game, using some of the artwork, and I emailed him to ask permission to tweak the required legalese just a little bit. It amused him, so he said yes.

That's Steve in a nutshell: if he likes it, he does it. So far, that's been working out pretty well.

Steve abandoned law school almost forty years ago to make games. His first design was **Ogre**, in 1977 – a folded map, a few rules, and a couple of sheets of cut-apart tokens that sold for \$2.95.

Thirty-five years later, his company Kickstarted a super-deluxe edition that weighed twenty-eight pounds and raised close to a million dollars. It had better pieces, bigger maps... but at its heart, it's the same timeless design. That's the quality of work that got him into the Origins Hall of Fame before he'd finished his first decade as a game designer.

Everybody seems to have their own favorite Steve Jackson game – **Car Wars**, **Illuminati**, **Munchkin**, **GURPS** – but at the heart of it, there's one man with a penchant for terrible jokes, bursting with offbeat ideas and steadily releasing them into the world. He started his own company thirty-five years ago this year, and it's still running strong. Oh, there have been complications along the way – a certain Secret Service raid that resulted in the formation of the EFF comes to mind – but Steve always finds a way to come out on top.

You see, he's always experimenting. One year he's printing a new version of the *Principia Discordia*. The next thing you know, he's turning first-person shooters into a board game, or introducing the Church of the SubGenius into *Illuminati*, or turning a card game about hack-and-slash fantasy adventure into high-seas antics with pirates and sharks. ("Shark! Shark!") If there's an idea he won't consider, I haven't found it yet.



And that's the official story. What it leaves out is more numerous than what it leaves in. For example, did you know that besides continuously delivering Schlock Mercenary on a daily basis, without fail, for decades, Howard Tayler has also cured cancer, created a warp drive, written all of Bill Shakespeare's plays under a pseudonym and is secretly John Lennon (who faked his death to start a webcomic)?

Okay, so some of that is slight hyperbole. But it's true that Howard has been continuously producing Schlock Mercenary on a daily basis since June of 2000. As well as doing a weekly podcast, creating an RPG and still somehow maintaining a good relationship with his family. The term here is 'hopeless workaholic'. Or, just possibly, it's a Napoleonic complex from being able to work in a teacup. And I'm not talking about the ones at Disney World.

The thing to love about Howard's Magnum Opus, Schlock Mercenary, is that it really gets space. I'm about to crib from myself here but space is vast and neat and huge and in Schlock Mercenary you get that impression of amazing scale. And the characters, with a few moments and exceptions, shrug that off and just plow right through in some amazingly hilarious ways. (Seriously, who would be stupid enough to hire a group of mercenaries to guard a theme park or a mall?) Not to mention they are, well, mercenaries. Their sole ambition in life is to break things, kill sophonts and get paid. Or as is once pointed out in Schlock's case: Kill it, eat it, make friends with it or take a bath.

On a personal level, Howard is one of those great guests who genuinely enjoys hanging out with fans. He's also a fun guy, super intelligent, great conversationalist, one of those people I really wish lived close enough to spend quality time with. Ditto for his wife, Sandra, who is unfortunately not making the con. We only seem to briefly interact at conventions which is a real shame. On the other hand, it's not like he has all the time in the world and I wouldn't want to get in the way of my daily dose of Schlock.

So if you're wandering around the con, keep an eye out for a guy who looks quite a bit like his character Kevin Andreysan. Or, you know, Tyler Vernon from Troy Rising.

He's a handsome man and a powerful one as well, but you'll generally have to get on your knees to look him in the eye.
