LibertyCon 9 Rules

ATTENDEES 17 YEARS OLD AND UNDER: All convention attendees who are 17 years of age or younger must be accompanied by a LEGAL GUARDIAN. A Legal Guardian is a person 21 years of age or older who will take financial and legal responsibility for the minor and will sign for each minor person for which he/she is responsible. Children under 7 must be accompanied by a parent or Legal Guardian at all times.

BADGES: Badges must be worn in plain sight above the waist at all times.

DRINKING AGE: To get a drinking badge, you must produce a VALID Military ID or Drivers License with your Picture on it to prove that you are at least 21 years of age. Minors caught drinking at LibertyCon will be hung, drawn, quartered, and thrown out of the convention. Also, WE WILL CONTACT YOUR PARENTS AND YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO FUTURE LIBERTYCONS!

EJECTION FROM THE CONVENTION: If you are ejected from LibertyCon8 because of violations of the convention rules or Tennessee State Law, your attendance fees will not be refunded.

LOST BADGE POLICY: If you lose your badge at the convention, you will have to purchase another one at the full purchase price of \$35. We are sorry to take this rough stand, but incidents of people (Not Fans) purchasing a replacement badge to give/sell to a friend at a reduced price only increases the cost of the convention for real fans and this is the only way we can curb it.

WEAPONS POLICY: All weapons and models of weapons must be "Peace Bonded" by one of our security staff before they may be worn with your costume or normal wearing apparel. This weapons policy will be strictly enforced!



JACK WILLIAMSON

These are the rumors we've heard about Jack Williamson:

The son of a Southwestern pioneering family, Jack Williamson began writing science fiction at the tender age of 20 years. Jack's devotion to science fiction has never wavered, but he did take time out once in order to do his duty as an Army Air Force Weather Forecaster during World War II.

Having left the New Mexico University in 1931 with no degree, he returned to college approximately 30 years later to earn his Bachelor of Arts degree. Once the college bug bit, he couldn't stop and so, went on to earn his Ph.D. in 1964 at the University of Colorado.

He has been a professor of English literature at Eastern New Mexico University. As a teacher, Jack was responsible for the first college course in Science Fiction literature. He also edited a guidebook for teaching science fiction.

Jack's works are not only educational in the arena of literature and the English language. The Humanoids, perhaps his best known novel, is used in MIT's graduate studies in Artificial Intelligence as an instructional example of where computer science may lead.

Now retired from teaching, Jack exercises a word processor in the creation of an autobiographical book about his own adventures in Science Fiction. Perhaps we will soon be entertained with stories of early World Cons, (he attended the first, held in New York City) and inner workings of the Science Fiction Writers of America (he served two terms as President).


For the body of his work (including over 30 novels and too numerous to list in this forum), Jack has been presented the Nebula Award and has been cited as a Grand Master of Science Fiction by SFWA. Only two other authors have been similarly honored.

We're looking forward to discovering the truth behind these rumors and further investigating the "Strange, strange world we live in (with) Master Jack".



The first time a professional writer ever spoke to me was many years ago in Champaign, Illinois. I was new to fandom, far from home, and dangerously shy. While I grazed at a vegetable tray a voice breathed over my shoulder in a rich baritone suited to portray God in a Cecil B. de Mille epic.

"Your fly is unzipped."

The voice belonged to the ever engaging, ever dapper Andrew J. Offutt V. Andy is a family man from Kentucky. He lives on The Funny Farm with his equally engaging and dapper wife, Jodie. He is a man of many facets, but is best known as a writer. His most popular creation may be Hanse, or Shadowspawn (or maybe it's Shadow-Spawn, or Shadows' Pawn), a character in the Thieves' World shared universe. Hanse now appears in two novels and several anthologies. As John Cleve, Andy has penned the nineteen volume Spaceways series. He gave us the novels of Robert E. Howard's Cormac Mac Art, the Tiana

Highrider, and many more. His output totals over fifty volumes.

Andy is also an editor. His Swords
Against Darkness anthologies of the late
1970s brought us many early works from
now veteran writers. He has been twice
president of the Science Fiction Writers of
America and is the fantasy/science fiction
consultant for Writer's Digest Criticism
Service.

My reference notes state that Andy Offutt began writing "diction" as a hobby at age eight. Now maybe that's a typo, since the "d" and "f" are neighbors on the keyboard, or maybe it's another of Andy's verbal acrobatics. Typo or not, it fits. He has an amazing command of the language, a shrewd knowledge of how words and phrases work together in surprising ways. Diction is what he uses for writing and speaking.


Too little is said about Andy's speaking ability. He can speak on just about any topic and make it engrossing. I'm glad he chooses to remain a writer, but had he the stomach for it, I believe he would go far as an entertainer, maybe a TV or radio personality. If you've not heard any of his talks as Master of Ceremonies, be forewarned. Bring along a supply of tissue; you may be in tears from laughter.

I'm thankful to Andy Offutt for introducing me to the whole genre of sword and sorcery. I was strictly a hard SF fan until reading King Dragon, which is still SF, but -- well, YOU read it! I'm thankful to him for showing me that humor in SF is not only OK but great fun. "Gone With the Gods," in Analog sometime in the mid-70s, kept me up half a night laughing. I'm indebted to him for breaking the ice, for I learned back then in Champaign that I could survive having such a dignified man rescue me from that embarrassing open fly. I need never be shy of writers again. What a pleasure it will be to see Andy Offutt at Liberty at last.


