ATTENDEES 17 YEARS OLD AND UNDER

All convention attendees who are 17 years of age or younger must be accompanied by a LEGAL GUARDIAN. A Legal Guardian is a person 21 years of age or older who will take financial and legal responsibility for the minor and will sign for each minor person for which he/she is responsible. A parent or Legal Guardian must accompany children under 7 years of age at all times.

BADGES

Badges must be worn in plain sight above the waist at all times.

BATHING

Remember, "If in doubt, take a bath!" Your fellow attendees will appreciate your courteous actions.

DRINKING AGE is 21! ~ IT IS THE LAW! ~ NOT UP FOR NEGOTIATION!

To get a drinking badge you must produce a VALID military ID or Drivers License with your picture on it to prove that you are at least 21 years of age. Minors caught drinking at LibertyCon will be hung, drawn, quartered, and thrown out of the convention. Also..

WE WILL CONTACT YOUR PARENTS AND/OR THE LAW - AND YOU WILL NOT

ROOM PARTIES

If you are having a room party, remember, this is the South. We are friendly and inclusive. If your party is in a hotel room with the door open or out in the Spill Over Party Area then the expectation is that the party is open to all LibertyCon attendees. If your party is intended to be private then please keep your door shut so that misunderstandings and hurt feelings don't occur. Also, Tennessee State Law does not allow the consumption of alcohol for anyone under 21 years of age. If you are serving alcohol, please check everyone's ID. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS NO MATTER WHERE YOUR PARTY IS LOCATED. LibertyCon will not assume any responsibility to check badges for any type of party. Don't assume if someone has a drinking badge that they are 21 or over... badges can be swapped.

GRILLS & OUTDOOR COOKING

No grills are allowed on the hotel premises. The hotel has informed us that this violates their insurance policy. We like the hotel management and would like to keep our great relationship with them.

EJECTION FROM THE CONVENTION

If you are ejected from LibertyCon because of violation of the convention rules or Tennessee State Law, then your attendance fees will not be refunded.

LOST BADGE POLICY

If you lose your badge at the convention, then you will have to purchase another one at the full admission price of \$50. We are sorry to take this rough stance, but incidents with people (Not Fans) purchasing a replacement badge to give/sell to a friend at a reduced price only increases the cost of the convention for real fans and this is the only way we can curb it.

This sticker should contain the nature of your medical condition and any special steps to be taken in an emergency, including the name and phone number of the person to contact should the need arise.


Kevin Hearne is the NYT bestselling author of the Iron Druid Chronicles and the forthcoming epic fantasy trilogy, The Seven Kennings.


John Ringo





If you, for some reason, don't know who Dan is, all I can say is go to a bookstore, walk through the Sci-Fi/Fantasy section and pick up a book, any book. The chance that you just grabbed a Dan Dos Santos cover is really high.

Dan's AMAZING at art. Don't take my word for ithe's been nominated for 5 Hugo's, won a Chesley, and won both Gold and Silver awards in Spectrum: The Best in Contemporary Fantastic Art. His illustrations have been on the covers of the New York Times bestseller list again and again. Dan's work speaks for itself, and his art sells books-in any business, that is a magic recipe for success.

If you're a fan, then you might already know all that stuff about Dan; but what you might not know is how much he gives back to the art community. At that critique I got from Dan way back in 2009, he encouraged me to go to The Illustration Master Class where Dan and other amazing artists teach illustration each summer. I went. and Dan taught me how to paint. The Illustration Master Class helped launch my career and the careers of so many more. Dan also runs one of the quintessential art blogs, Muddy Colors, where Dan has organized an amazing cast of artists who continue to comment, push, and teach the art



community to be better at their craft. With his busy schedule, he doesn't have to do any of this: but he continues to do so because he likes it. I've heard him say a few times that people helped him get his start, and now it's his turn; but in my opinion, he's given back way more than he took. That's good place to be.

Over the years, Dan's role in my life has changed: first as an unknown dude at a con, then teacher, mentor, and now friend. Dan's a family man with a wonderful wife and two precocious boys. He figured out the things in life he was passionate about at a young age, and he's devoted his life to those things. He is thoughtful, hard working, and fun at parties, but he doesn't like beer so make sure to bring him the fancy stuff.

Science Guest of Honor

Dr. Elisa Quintana

Dr. Elisa Quintana is a scientist who searches for planets around other stars using space telescopes and builds computer models to study how these planets form. She is best known for leading a team of astronomers to confirm Kepler-186f, the first Earthsized planet found to orbit another star in a region that could potentially host extraterrestrial life.

She is passionate about sharing her experiences as a Latina scientist and was named 2015 Scientist of the Year at the Hispanic Engineer National Achievement Awards.

She grew up in Silver City, New Mexico. Her father, Leroy, is a Chicano poet and has written extensively about his upbringing and experiences in the Vietnam War. His poems are taught in Chicano literature classes across the country.

Elisa received a B.S. in Physics from the University of California, San Diego, with a minor in Theatre and Dance. Her interest in space sciences began while working at the California Space Institute at UCSD with former astronaut and physics professor Dr. Sally Ride on a project called KidSat (now EarthKam). The program consisted of a camera onboard the space shuttle that took photos of the Earth selected by school children, and Elisa's role was to coordinate the space shuttle orbits with the locations on Earth.

During her graduate school in Michigan, she received a NASA Graduate Student Researchers Program fellowship which allowed her to move to NASA Ames Research Center in California to perform her thesis research. She worked to create computer models to study planet formation and was a member of the team that developed the Kepler Mission.



After graduate school, Elisa worked as a software engineer and wrote the code that is used to calibrate the Kepler flight data. She received the 2010 NASA Software of the Year Award as part of the Kepler software team. After 5 years of software engineering, she decided that she wanted to return to pursuing her research career. In 2011 she was appointed as a scientist with the SETI Institute where she continued to discover new exoplanets using data from the Kepler spacecraft.

Elisa now lives in Silver Spring, Maryland and works as an Astrophysicist at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center. She serves as Deputy Project Scientist for Communications on the upcoming Wide Field Infrared Survey Telescope.


Special Guest of Honor Todd McCaffrey

he second of three special editions produced by the legendary SF author, Anne McCaffrey, Todd Johnson McCaffrey was born in 1956 in New Jersey. Growing up as he did among strange creatures, such as dragons, Hrrubans and his mother's science fiction writer colleagues, it was perhaps inevitable that he, too, would one day become an author. He had early training in the discipline of literature, beginning to read science fiction as a child, then attending SF conventions with Anne, and living on macaroni and cheese for a painfully extended time while the family moved from inexpensive flat to inexpensive flat all over Dublin. (Todd once remarked to his mother that it would be nice if they could have mac and cheese sometime just because they wanted to, not because they had to.) Keen-eved readers will have spotted Todd as a character in at least two places in Anne's books. Todd in Decision at Doona and Lord Jaxom in The White Dragon.

He will modestly tell you he flunked out of college, but he eventually earned two degrees, in mechanical engineering and political science. Todd went on to serve in the US Army in Stuttgart, Germany. Once liberated from wearing army green, Todd set out to conquer the lightest element on the periodic table, assuming his secret identity, Mr. Hydrogen. It was so secret, in fact, that his dreams of bringing humanity forward into the hydrogen age were pipped to the post by Toyota and Honda, when they developed their own fuel cells. Todd turned instead to the practical concept of making money, joining a computer startup as a programmer.

Todd went to work one summer as an intern for Mayfair Games, which was designing the Dragonriders of Pern role play game, and became part of the Mayfair extended family. Bill Fawcett, one of the partners, saw Todd's writing talent, and hired him to write Slammers Down! for his Combat Command choose-yourown-adventure book series (Ace, 1988), Todd's first professional publication and sortie into military science fiction. Since then. Todd has written several short stories for military SF anthologies and others, and a teleplay for the animated series Dinosaucers.

Dragons remained the chief family business. Todd wrote the chapter on training dragons for the Dragonlover's Guide to Pern (Del Rey, 1988). Later, he was conscripted by Anne's editor at Del Rey Books to keep his mother writing fiction by taking over her proposed autobiography, which was eventually published as Dragonholder. While he was taking notes for that, he and Anne discussed ideas for future novels they could write together. Todd didn't realize she had taken it seriously until months later, when Anne called him in the middle of the night, weeping over one of the plot points of the story they had discussed. She finished Skies of *Pern* by herself, but her last five Pern novels were collaborations with Todd. They fell into a natural rhythm, throwing ideas back and forth. The first chapter of Dragon's Kin needed four passes to get it right, but they were delighted with the results. Todd was proud and touched when Anne told him "I trust you implicitly." Over time, Todd took on more and more of the general writing and copy editing. He also wrote three solo novels set in the Third Pass, Dragonsblood, Dragonheart, and Dragongirl.



Todd is at least indirectly responsible for the Don Hodge charity anthology program run by the Superstars Writing Seminar. Kevin J. Anderson liked to use purple unicorns as an example of how a professional responds to a challenge set by an editor. Todd said if Kevin ever published a purple unicorn anthology, he wanted to be in it. The idea was set in motion, and in 2013, One Horn to Rule Them All was published, with Todd's stories "Rhubarb and Beets" and "Red Roses" bracketing the other stories in the book. To date, the program has earned enough to sponsor almost a dozen students to the seminar.


His newest book is City of Angels (WordFire Press), about nanotechnology, artificial intelligence and Los Angeles. It has received excellent reviews, including in Galaxy's Edge Magazine. Due out in early September is his next novel. The Jupiter Game (WordFire).

In between writing projects, Todd is working toward a MFA degree, having fun driving his professors crazy. He has one child, Declan Elliott McCaffrey, now 23 and also attending college in California. They have recently acquired a very cute dog. Ask to see pictures of his puppy and his art installations.

Antonia Katherine Flora Weisskopf was born in Waltham, MS to an astrophysicist and a college librarian. These early influences set her on a path to her love of reading and science fiction and fantasy in particular. When she was 12, her father got a job at NASA in Huntsville, AL and the family moved to Rocket City USA. And the voyage into Southern Fandom began shortly afterward.

Toni's first convention was MidSouthCon '80. She had already joined the Southern Fandom Confederation and she had read about the convention, who's Guest of Honor was Fredrick Pohl. She had just finished reading his fannish memoirs, The Way the Future Was, telling tales of past conventions, some a bit on the indecent side. Luckily, her parents had not read the book and thus began a long tradition of convention attendance. At that same convention, Mike and Nelda Kennedy posted a sign-up sheet for those interested in starting a club in Huntsville. Toni, of course, signed up, thus becoming a charter member of the fledgling North Alabama Science Fiction Association. As if that wasn't enough, she also started the Science Fiction Society at Oberlin College.

Toni joined Baen Books as an editorial assistant, and worked her way up from there. She was Executive Editor for many years, and following the death of founder Jim Baen in 2006, became Publisher. During that time, Toni has created an innovative e-publishing program, worked

with established authors, discovered a bevy of new authors, and created the Jim Baen Memorial Short Story Award, the Baen Fantasy Adventure Award, and the Baen Best Military SF & Adventure SF Reader's Choice Award.

Toni has also volunteered with many conventions throughout her fannish career. This includes her first WorldCon. ConFederation in Atlanta in 1986. She was most recently the Co-Chair and head of Programming for DeepSouthCon 50, held in Huntsville.

Since then, Toni has been a part of and done too many things to list (unless we print a bigger program book). Editing and authoring in the Southern Fandom Press Association, updating the Southern Fandom Confederation Handbook & History, compiling Greasy Grimy Gopher Guts (along with Josepha Sherman), editing anthologies and novels alike, finding, mentoring and playing cat herder to many of our favorite LibertyCon authors and artists... this talented lady has done it all!

Toni has won her share of awards. She was the first person to receive the triple crown of Southern Fandom. In 1994, she received both the Phoenix and the Rubble awards. She got the final jewel of the Rebel in 2000. She won the Hank Reinhardt Fandom award in 2009. She has been nominated twice for the Best Editing Hugo. In 2015, she won the Neffy award for Best Editor. Her latest is the Kate Wilhelm Solstice Award; given by SFWA for distinguished contributions to the science fiction and fantasy community.



In addition to all her work as a publisher/fan, Toni is also the mother of Katie, who turned 23 this year. Toni married the love of her life, legendary Southern Fan Hank Reinhardt, who passed away in 2007.

Be sure to look for Toni on some panels this weekend and do your best to make it to her Baen Books Travelling Slide Show. This is always a popular event where she shows off cover art of upcoming Baen titles, so we can find out what is in the pipeline. She usually has prizes available, which she distributes to the congregated fen. (If you are active or former military, you have a better chance than most of getting a free book. Baen is the leading producer of Military SF after all.)

And in addition to all of the craziness above, she and Regina are the unofficial official LibertyCon advisors to the Chair... or that could just be another part of her cat herding duties.

And don't be fooled into a game of Hearts or Scrabble with her. She will play you like a piano.




LIBERTYCON 30 IS DEDICATED TO TWO OF OUR BEST WHO I WILL SEE AGAIN, KLON NEWELL AND KERRY GILLEY By Tim Bolgeo

In 1986, when there be fan wars in the Big Nooga, a group of hardy fans decided to start a new Science Fiction and Fantasy Convention. The new convention would be based on old fashioned ideas that we all enjoyed in southern conventions: camaraderie, good times, a limited size event, and bheer in the bathtubs. Eight stalwart fannish friends came together and started organizing what would become LibertyCon in September of 1986 just after the 1986 World Science Fiction Convention in Atlanta, Confederation.

Klon Newell served on the Board of Directors of LibertyCon (LC) as the first Director of Programming from LC1, July 10-12, 1987 to LC8, July 8-10, 1994. He served with distinction and professionalism. After Klon retired from the board, he took over the position of head huckster for a few more years. Until age and illness overcame him, Klon was always one of our primary ambassadors for LibertyCon for fandom all over the country. All of us used to kid Klon about looking like Santa Claus with his white hair and beard. But that mild exterior hid a sharp mind and a devilish wit.

Kerry Gilley was a huckster who started off with us at LibertyCon and helped mold the organization on what we became. Kerry joined the Board of Directors of LibertyCon as the Director of Programming from LC12, May 22-24, 1994 to LC23, July 9-11, 2010. Like Klon, Kerry was an excellent head of programming and served the Board well. Kerry had a strange sense of humor at times that some people had problem understanding. I used to pick on him and told him that his humor was tacky. Kerry just laughed. He was harmless. More importantly, he was a fierce friend to those who even tired to meet him halfway. People used to underestimate Kerry because his speech impediment. But Kerry had a sharp mind and could really sting you with a quip if he wanted to.

Both Klon and Kerry were close friends of mine. Well actually, they were closer to brothers who I miss more than any of you will ever know. They were also honorary uncles to my children and both used Casa Bolgeo, as their Chattanooga Home. I know that I will see them again sometime in the future.
